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Pastor's Article:

Cooperation - The Natural Result of Relationships

As we approach the end of the Easter season (that time between Easter proper and Ascension Sunday) and come up to Pentecost and the birth of the Church, I'd like to take a moment to consider what the nature of the early apostolic Church was. How did it operate? What were its priorities? How did individual members and Church leaders work together in this common mission? And what might this Scriptural template for the Church have to say to us (both individually and corporately) at Immanuel United Church of Christ?

The answer to all of this can be found towards the beginning of the book of Acts, where we read:

And they devoted themselves to the apostles' teaching and the fellowship, to the breaking of bread and the prayers. And awe came upon every soul, and many wonders and signs were being done through the apostles. And all who believed were together and had all things in common. And they were selling their possessions and belongings and distributing the proceeds to all, as any had need. And day by day, attending the temple together and breaking bread in their homes, they received their food with glad and generous hearts, praising God and having favor with all the people. And the Lord added to their number day by day those who were being saved.

(Acts 2:42-47, ESV)

Note the different items here:

- **The apostles' teaching, fellowship, breaking of bread, prayers:** All of this refers to corporate worship with preaching, fellowship, Holy Communion, and common prayer. In other words, this is an expression of God's love for us and our returning love to them in worship and devotion.
- **They held all things in common, gave to all who were in need, and received their daily bread with gratitude:** All of this refers to mutual support for all people. There is no greedy über-capitalistic self-centeredness here in the early Church, but a full understanding that everything we have is a gift from God and is to be used for the benefit of others. In other words, this is an expression of the love we should have for our neighbors.

And this cooperative approach applies not only to the local Church congregation (whether the Church in Jerusalem described in this lection or our own home in Immanuel United Church of Christ) but also to the wider Church. Consider the example of the first Church council (what we'd call a General Synod):

But some men came down from Judea and were teaching the brothers, Unless you are circumcised according to the custom of Moses, you cannot be saved." And after Paul and Barnabas had no small dissension and debate with them, Paul and Barnabas and some of the others were appointed to go up to Jerusalem to the apostles and the elders about this question... When they came to Jerusalem, they were welcomed by the church and the apostles and the elders, and they declared all that God had done with them. But some believers who belonged to the party of the Pharisees rose up and said, It is necessary to circumcise them and to order them to keep the law of Moses." The apostles and the elders were gathered together to consider this matter.

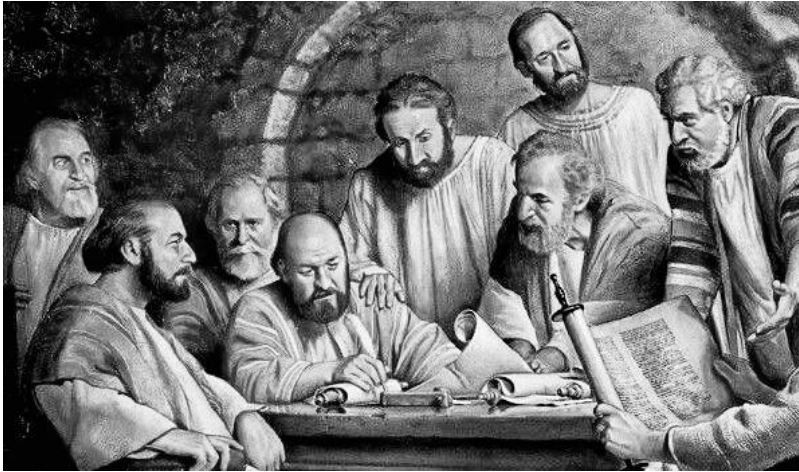
• (Acts 15:1-2 & 4-6, ESV)

Note how it was not one person - one bishop, one conference minister, one pastor, one apostle, or one anything else - who made the decision, but the apostles (the ordained clergy) and the elders (the supporting leaders of the congregations) *together* who discussed the matter. And when they came to their decision, how did they describe it? They said, "*For it has seemed good to the Holy Spirit and to us,*" (Acts 15:28a, ESV). The decision they came to was God's, and they as ministers and elders serving God assented to the Holy Spirit's decision on the issue. The apostle Paul also condemned the spirit of independent, self-assertive leadership and held up our unity in Christ when he wrote to the Church in Corinth:

- *I appeal to you, brothers, by the name of our Lord Jesus Christ, that all of you agree, and that there be no divisions among you, but that you be united in the same mind and the same judgment. For it has been reported to me by Chloe's people that there is quarreling among you, my brothers. What I mean is that each one of you says, I follow Paul," or I follow Apollos," or I follow Cephas [Peter]," or I follow Christ." Is Christ divided? Was Paul crucified for you? Or were you baptized in the name of Paul?*

• (1 Corinthians 1:10-13, ESV)

These too are examples of collaboration, including both love of God (listening to the Holy Spirit) and love of neighbor (having a representative body consider issues and hearing from all sides in an open assembly before coming to a decision).



Given this example and direction on what the Church is and how it should behave, how do you think we should move forward as Immanuel United Church of Christ? How should we position ourselves to work in greater cooperation internally to our Church? For example: how can each of us help in worship (reading, special music, etc.)? How should we position ourselves to work in greater cooperation with other local Churches? For example: how can each of us foster stronger relationships with the other RCCC and RCF Churches and our common worship, fellowship, and mission projects, and encourage greater participation in the same? (*On a slight side-note: our Conference Minister Franz Rigert mentioned our RCCC work in his "State of the Conference" address at the Annual Meeting*). How should we position ourselves to work in greater cooperation with the wider community? For example: how can we each support some one or two of our mission projects - Laura's Pantry, the Warming Center, student homelessness, etc. - on a regular and stable basis? Or, how can we each share the Gospel, the good news of the love of God with our neighbors in the wider world?



While there certainly are different positions and leadership roles to be filled in the Church (pastors, elders, deacons, musicians, secretaries, missionaries, etc.), these are not in-and-of-themselves the Church. As a great hymn reminds us,

*The Church is not a building,
the Church is not a steeple,
the Church is not a resting place,
the Church is a people!
I am the Church!
You are the Church!
We are the Church together!
All who follow Jesus, all around the world,
yes, we're the Church together!*

(We Are the Church)

Given this, what is your active, participatory place in the wider cooperative community that is the Church, the body of Christ?

She indicated the paperless billing issue with Public Service should be resolved going forward. Rod T paid for one month's billing using his credit card and will submit for reimbursement. Rod T received a text from Kim Hartlaub indicating she received a second check which will be returned to Joya to be voided. Rod T and Jen M are meeting with Joya tomorrow morning so Jen can be reintroduced to Joya. Motion made by Brett K, seconded by Keith R to approve report. Approved.**
5. Pastor's report - Worship planning - Church events
 - a. Communion for March—Sunday March 1 – **Date confirmed.**
 - b. Palm Sunday – Donkey Walk and Mission Committee Event (**United for Confections and Causes or Uplifting Confections and Community**) – **Donkeys again provided by Karl and Carol Knoener. The UCC acronym as shown in the above examples will be decided upon soon. The Palm Sunday service will be slightly different this year and the typical dessert auction mission will be held that day also. Additional Details to be determined.**
 - c. **These Printer update – Unit is installed and working. Color copying is available. Keri K is up and running as the new Church Secretary.**
 - d. **Recorded music accompaniment and/or leads on accompanists – The taped music recordings are working on the Sunday's when we have no organist. We continue to look for organists. Jen M. is checking with Lakeland Music Department for organists/pianists. Some buttons on the organ have lost programming and working on getting that resolved.**
 - e. **Federal and State Tax Withholding – There were issues with the Federal and State tax withholdings on Rev. Sean's salary. have been resolved and now they will be paid quarterly.**
 - f. **Remove Mike Giese from membership due to death – He passed away in 2024 and per Gene M. he was not on the membership list.**
 - g. **Remove Zach Nauschutz from membership due to relocation – A Letter of Termination of Membership was granted for Zach N. Rev Sean and Gene M. to review membership list and mailing list. Possible Active membership and Inactive membership list to be developed. Several members did not receive the Annual Report by mail.
Motion made by Keith R., seconded by Brett K to approve Pastor's report.
Approved.**
6. Old business
 - a. **Update on how the chili supper went – All reports are that the chili supper went well. Nearly sold out with the remaining quarts purchased by Butch and Anne F. Small boxes will again be saved by Laura's Pantry for this event. Final profit is not yet available.**

- a. Insurance transition – is anything else needed – **Brett K. to order the water shutoff valve that detects leakage in water system.**
 - b. Mission Committee suggestions for Special Gifts distribution – **There is money available from the Special Gifts Fund for Missions. \$1400.00 each will be given to the Warming Center in Sheboygan, Mental Health America and Safe Harbor.**
 - c. Update on Confirmation dessert auction donation to St. Jude’s – **Distribution of funds to St. Jude’s has been taken care of.**
 - d. Update credit card - names on the cards, credit limit, cashing in reward points – **There will be two church credit cards issued, one with Rev Sean’s name and one with Keri K’s name. \$500 limit on the cards. Ed Pahl is working on the Rewards points.**
 - e. Update on Sheboygan Warming Center meal on Tuesday Feb. 17 - **Karl and Carol Knoener are donating the meat for the meal. Serving starts around 6:30 pm. Providing shredded beef on buns along with potatoes, pasta salad and cookies. Typically serve 55-60 people. Meal is served at St. Luke United Methodist Church on Ontario Ave in Sheboygan.**
 - f. UCC Everywhere website maintenance fee – any new info – **Seems no one can determine if fees are required. We will keep using the website until further notice.**
 - g. Repair needed for the church heating system – any updates – **Taken care of by Ed Pahl.**
7. New business
- a. Thank you note from Kim Hartlaub – **Kim sent a Thank You card to the congregation for the gift received for her many years of organ playing.**
 - b. Gas bill glitch – **Glitch fixed.**
 - c. Update salary schedule form – **New names being added and form being updated by Rev. Sean.**
 - d. Zoom subscription – currently paying a monthly fee but there is a free version (40-minute meetings with up to 100 participants) – decide if we maintain the paid subscription or drop down to the free version – **Monthly fee varies from \$16.99 to \$21.99 depending on usage. Rev. Sean has a subscription if needed. Since Zoom is hardly ever used, we will change to the free system. Motion made by Brett K, seconded by Keith R. Approved.**
 - e. Membership update – **Rev Sean and Gene M will be working on updating the list. Rod T will help with this task. Active and Inactive membership lists being discussed. Parameters will need to be developed for this list.**
 - f. German visitors – update on any plans – dates, number coming, etc – **Email received from Lynn Marten today indicating she has heard from the Germans. As of now planning on leaving Germany October 18 and returning October 28. 18 people are currently interested. Slight changes to this to be expected.**
 - g. Church use – discuss if an update in pricing is needed – **Continue discussions about this item.**
 - h. Annual meeting of the Conference is April 10-11 – we usually ask if any members would like to attend – Kristy Pahl has volunteered to go – **Rev Sean is going and Kristy Pahl has volunteered to go. Pastor and 2 voting Lay delegates are allowed to attend.**

- i. Donation for Mission Trip – **Karl and Carol K will be going. Rev Sean will no longer be able to go. Motion made by Rod T, seconded by Keith R to donate \$100 to this trip. Approved.**

1. Call meeting to order – **Jennifer Marten called the meeting to order at 7:02 pm. Those in attendance were Rev. Sean, Gene M., Karl N., Rod T., Jen M., and Brett K.**
2. Opening prayer – **Reverend Sean gave the Opening Prayer.**
3. Review of the secretary's minutes from last meeting (February 9, 2026) – **Motion made by Rod T., seconded by Brett K to approve minutes. Minutes Approved.**
4. Treasurer's report - Submitted by email and phone by Joya Cox – **Joya called in to the meeting. The payment to St. Jude has been made. Jen M has been reimbursed for the payment of the WPS invoice. Hopefully all issues with billing have now been resolved. The Town of Herman sent a letter requesting info to complete a required Tax Exempt Form. Joya will help with filling that out. Joya and Jen M to meet Wednesday morning. Motion made by Rod T., seconded by Brett K to approve the report. Report Approved.**
5. Pastor's report - Worship planning - Church events
 - a. Communion for April – Maundy Thursday, April 2nd and Easter Sunday, April 5th – **Confirmed by Reverend Sean that there are two dates of communion in April.**
 - b. Palm Sunday – Donkey Walk and Mission Committee Event (Uplifting Confections and Community) – **The Donkey Walk is at 8 am. The Dessert Auction is also on that day.**
 - c. Annual meeting of the Conference - April 10-11 – **Rev Sean and Kristi Pahl will be attending and carpooling daily. There is room for one additional person to attend.**
 - d. Memorial Day falls on 5/24 which is also Pentecost Sunday (5/17 is Ascension Sunday and 5/31 is Trinity Sunday) – options to remember those we have lost in the past year while celebrating the three joyous church holy days.
 - i. Observe Memorial Day on 5/17 as part of Ascension Sunday – the realities of the Lord ascending into heaven and our dead going to be with God in heaven thematically go together
 - ii. Observe Memorial Day on its own on 6/7, preserving it as a separate observance.
It was determined to observe Memorial Day events on May 17th. Families of those we have lost in the past year will be notified as to the change.
 - e. Regretfully remove Peter Warner from membership due to death. – **Motion made to remove Peter Warner from membership by Brett K., seconded by Gene M. Motion Approved.**
6. Old business
 - a. Update on how the chili supper – any idea of total made? – **Nikki Schumacher has submitted receipts so the final will be coming soon.**
 - b. Special Gifts distribution – **Gifts have been distributed to the Warming Center in Sheboygan, Mental Health America, and Safe Harbor. Kristy Pahl added a note to each one before mailing them out.**
 - c. Update credit card - cashing in reward points – **Still in process. Brett K will check on it.**

- d. Sheboygan Warming Center meal – **Event was well attended by our church. Food was awesome. It was well received. 70 people were served. We may do this again in the future.**
 - e. Zoom – **Pro account has been cancelled. We have the free version. Email contact to be switched to Immanuel’s Gmail account. Motion made by Brett K., and seconded by Rod T., to switch email account. Motion Approved.**
 - f. Membership update – **The church membership is being entered into Excel spreadsheets by Rev Sean. It is approx. 1/3 done. We are striving to have accurate membership lists. Even though this info is being put into a spreadsheet, the old cards need to be retained.**
 - g. German visitors – **A meeting was held last week about the visit from the Germans. Currently there are 18 people coming. The dates are October 17th to the 25th. Working on finding housing and transportation for this event. Also determining the composition of this group. Letting other RCC churches know of this event as well. Next meeting is after church on April 26, 2026.**
 - h. Organ and Organists – **50 songs can be loaded into the organ. No other organists to date. We will post our part-time opening for an organist on the UCC Musicians Association site.**
7. New business
- a. Palm Sunday – **Consistory will provide refreshments after donkey walk.**
 - b. Maundy Thursday – **Consistory will provide refreshments after service.**
 - c. Putting up the cross for Easter. **The cross for the Easter plants will be put up in church on April 3, 2026.**
 - d. Water leak in parsonage – **Water was leaking from a galvanized water pipe in parsonage basement and was noticed by Rev. Sean on Wednesday 3-4-2026. The leak was at the location of an in-line water filter housing. This was on the line that runs from the parsonage to the church. Neumann Plumbing was called. They were able to come out the same day and replaced a section of the galvanized line with copper pipe and fittings. Removed water filter housing. Pipe is no longer leaking.**
 - e. Elevator – low oil light flashing – **Elevator was found to not be working on Thursday 3-5-2026 by Jennifer M. She contacted Edgar Karsteadt. 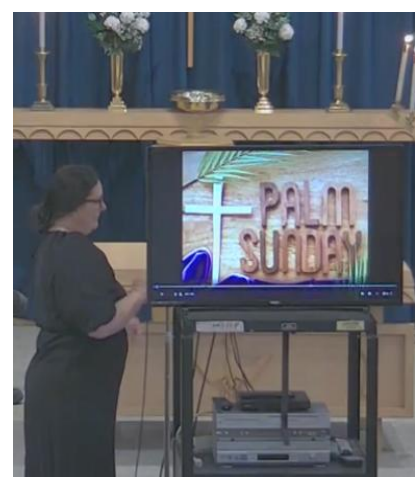
Dessert Auction:

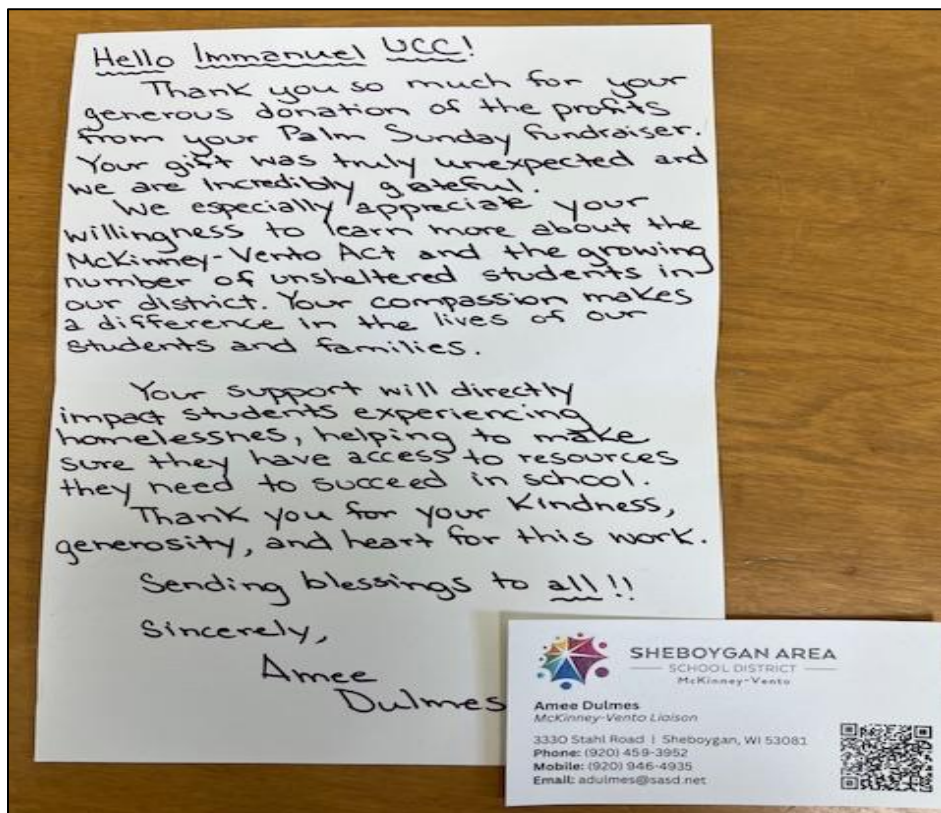


